DOJ Private Counsel Program Authorization

- Federal Debt Recovery Act (FDRA) of 1986 authorized pilot program for Attorney General to retain at least 4 Private Counsels for a 3-year period to collect delinquent federal debts
- Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 expanded Attorney General's authority to retain Private Counsel in as many USAO districts as deemed appropriate

DOJ Private Counsel Program Benefits to Agencies

- Support the Agency's mission to resolve the debt balances by primarily securing the government's interest through obtaining a judgment and ultimately collecting the debt or resolving the matter satisfactorily.
- PC furnishes all legal services, including representation in negotiation, compromise, settlement, and litigation, to collect delinquent debts owed the United States




DOJ Private Counsel Program Debt Assignments

- As of 2018, participating USAOs assigned over 32,000 debts to Private Counsel
- Debt Assignments to Private Counsel are made up of federal non-tax civil debt, both secured and unsecured.
- Secured debt mainly consists of foreclosures which take a significant amount of time to complete. Private Counsel are compensated for secured debt collections and associated activities on a fixed fee basis.
- Unsecured debt mainly consists of Department of Education student loans with principal balances less than \$100K. Private Counsel are compensated for unsecured debt collection on a contingency fee basis.




DOJ Private Counsel Program Secured and Unsecured Debts

Debt Assigned by Current Balance



DOJ Private Counsel Program Federal Agency Collections

In FY 2017, Private Counsel were referred 1,400 cases





DOJ Private Counsel Program Department of Treasury Pilot

- In October 2016, DOJ and Treasury's Bureau of Fiscal Service (BFS) began a pilot program to:
 - Test the feasibility of having DOJ's Nationwide Central Intake Facility (NCIF) assist BFS with completing packages to refer to DOJ for litigation or enforced collection;
 - Evaluate the DOJ policy of requiring the identification of assets before referral to DOJ;
 - Examine the criteria that should be used for cases referred to the PC; and,
 - Support BFS' mission to resolve debt balances by primarily securing the government's interest through obtaining a judgment and collecting the debt.




DOJ Private Counsel Program Department of Treasury Pilot

- Of the 297 pilot cases* assigned to Private Counsel:
 - 85 complaints have filed;
 - 46 judgments have been entered;
 - 25 liens have been obtained;
 - Over \$80,000 in payments have been received;
 - 13 payment plans have been established for debts totaling over \$180,000.



DOJ Private Counsel Program Federal Agency Collections

- Private Counsel collected over \$125 Million in the last 5 years for Federal Agencies
- Private Counsel collected \$22 million in delinquent debt on behalf of Federal Agencies in FY 2017
