SIR: In compliance with instructions received from you, I have prepared for publication a Combined Statement of the Receipts and Disbursements of the Government, by appropriations, exclusive of the principal of the public debt, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1876, exhibiting the various sources of the revenues; the *apparent expenses* of each branch of the service under the several Departments, and of each Department, on account of "salaries," "ordinary expenses," "public works," "miscellaneous," and "unusual and extraordinary;" and the *actual expenses* of the same, and the *actual revenues*, by deductions from them of those items which appear in both accounts by requirements of law, but which are not *actual revenues* or *true expenditures*, and other items on account of branches of the service intended to be self-supporting, the expenses and revenues of which must by law enter into the accounts of the Treasury.
